Danger of unnecessary injury	Ensure that no one with a history of back or neck problems or who suffers from a heart complaint uses the inflatable or anyone who is feeling unwell. Pregnant women may NOT use any equipment at anytime.	1	1	1	ADULT SUPERVISION AT ALL TIMES	
Risk of inflatable blowing away or tipping	On grass, we anchor every anchor point with 16mm x 380mm steel anchor stakes. Sandbags may be used indoors	4	1	1	Operator checks the weather forecast up to the day. Supervisor on the day monitors weather conditions and inflatables to be switched off if necessary.	
Risk of electrocution	All electricalsare pat tested regularly. IP44 rated (waterproof) cables to be used outdoors.	1	1	1	All electricalsare visually checked for damage up on set up and rcd's are used.	

Tripping on cables	Excess cable will be stowed at the back of the inflatable.	1	1	1	Cables covering footpaths will be covered with rubber cable covers.
